LOCAL NURSE RECOGNIZED AS 2020 FREE CLINIC NURSE OF THE YEAR AT OHIO FREE CLINIC APPRECIATION AWARDS

Columbus, OH -12/9/2020 – Ohio University Heritage Community Clinic, along with free clinics across Ohio, is celebrating the Sixth Annual Free Clinic Appreciation Month. With the passage of House Bill 320 in 2014, the Ohio Legislature designated December as Free Clinic Appreciation Month. On Wednesday's virtual celebration, Tobie Newberry, DNP, RN, was recognized as Ohio's 2020 Free Clinic Nurse of the Year.

"Our clinic fills a critical need for health care services, particularly for hard-working Southeastern Ohioans struggling to make ends meet," said Carole Merckle. "Free Clinic Appreciation Month gives us an opportunity to celebrate all that we have accomplished, and how we've met the needs of the community during the pandemic."

In 2019, Ohio's free clinics provided more than 150,000 visits to over 55,000 patients, with volunteer physicians, nurses and other healthcare professionals providing nearly 180,000 hours of care to those who have fallen through the cracks of our healthcare system in Ohio. Ohio's free clinics are on track to obtain similar service hours even during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, 31 of Charitable Healthcare Network's 52 clinics remained open to provide medical services in a time when their communities needed them most. Heritage Community Clinic was able to expand and adapt their services to continue serving their local community while upholding the safety of their staff and patients.

Charitable Healthcare Network (CHN), formerly the Ohio Association of Free Clinics, advocates on behalf of Ohio's free clinics and the people they serve. We do not provide direct health care services on-site, but support those clinics that do. Free clinic services vary, but may include: primary care, prescription assistance, dental, vision, behavioral health and other specialties. With the recent impacts of COVID-19, the number of unemployed and uninsured/under-insured citizens is skyrocketing like never before. Using cost-effective strategies, such as in-kind services, building partnerships with other nonprofit organizations and donations of health care resources and time, we are able to support free clinics so they can provide for the health care needs of their patients. These strategies mean that every dollar invested in free clinics brings nearly \$6.45 in care for patients.
